Infamous game review The Infamous is a comic book storyline following Cole MacGrath as he takes down a criminal named the Freak, who has the ability to turn people into Incorporeal beings. Other characters include Delsin Rowe, a young boy who was the first Conduit, and Emiko, a young girl who survived the experiment that created the Conduits. The story was written by Mark J. Millar and illustrated by Greg Capullo, with a monthly book published by the same name. The first volume was released on November 8, 2009, and the final volume was released on June 2, 2011. Infamous Volume One is 483 pages long, and the final volume of the series is 595 pages. The Infamous is a self-contained story, but there is a loose connection to the previous events of the comic book series, with Delsin having powers similar to the ones that he used in the first story, and Cole having been the victim of the Freak's influence. There are many references to the previous series, such as Delsin having a dog named Beagle, and the costumes of the main characters having been modified by the events of the previous comic. Volume One Cole MacGrath is a member of an elite police task force in Seattle, Washington. One night, while on patrol, he runs into Delsin Rowe, who is being stalked by a group of thugs. Delsin explains that he has recently gained powers, and that he has developed the ability to transform into an Incorporeal being called a Conduit. He does not remember how he acquired the powers, but he says that they are not his to use. Cole takes him to a local bar, where he meets Emiko, a young girl who is very streetwise, and happens to have the ability to transform herself into a Conduit. The group goes back to Delsin's house, where they discover that it is being watched by the villains, and that an Incorporeal being called a Possessor has been stalking Delsin. The gang flees, but they are captured by the men who are following them. In the morning, Cole and Emiko go to the police station, but they are unable to track down Delsin and the Possessor, who are suspected of being the same person. The thugs are released, and Cole and Emiko discover that Delsin and the Possessor are identical twins. Emiko's cousin
